Dear Mr. Hanes:

As the graduate student who will be making the study of the school children in Winston-Salem will probably be ready to begin the work before long I'm writing to ask which channel of contribution will be preferable. I am assuming that a charitable or educational institution will be desirable. This, it seems to me, can be either Birthright, or the University of North Carolina. Should you prefer it might also be the Eugenics Board (the survey in Orange County was financed by some funds I contributed to the Board) or the Winston-Salem School Board. Probably the simplest would be the University, for they have already handled funds for the Orange County study transmitted by the Eugenics Board. There might be politically undesirable aspects of funds in the hands of the Winston-Salem School Board.

If you will let me know your preference as to channel I'll try to make the further arrangements on that basis.

I have found that there <sup>are</sup> advantages in making such contributions with stock having a low cost, markedly below the current market. The market value of the stock is deductible from income for tax purposes, and it can be sold by the charitable organization without tax on the profits. Would you find that a useful means?
