Dear Frank:

The purpose of this letter is to request relocation of the Jordan Lake boundary west of the intersection of NC Highway 751 and Fayetteville Road and a corresponding change in the watershed protection overlay for the parcel identification numbers shown in Exhibit A. Our request is based on data generated from technology that utilizes the global positioning system and is more specifically known as the "Javad System." This system is survey grade and reads both American and Russian satellites for the collection of more accurate data.

We contracted with S.D. Puckett and Associates to locate the eastern boundary of Jordan Lake adjacent to New Hope Creek (see Exhibit B). The survey field work was conducted in April on days when the Jordan Lake water level, as measured by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, was close to the normal pool elevation of 216 feet (see Exhibit C).

The resulting survey is shown in Exhibit D and depicted in two maps. The first map entitled "Survey 1 for Neal Hunter" shows the eastern most point of the normal pool level (216 feet) and the associated ½ mile and 1 mile radius beyond Jordan Lake. The second map entitled "Survey 2 for Neal Hunter" shows the eastern boundary of Jordan Lake at the normal pool level using multiple data points and the corresponding ½ mile and 1 mile radii beyond the lake.

Exhibit E is our interpretation of the revised F/J-A and F/J-B boundaries which we present for your consideration. Please let me know if you have any questions or need additional information.
